TITLE: The Count of Monte Cristo AUTHOR: Alexandre Dumas

POINT OF VIEW: 3rd person

SETTING:

Time: 1815-1844. beginning during Napoleon's

captivity on Elba.

Place: Marseilles. Château d'If. Rome, Paris, Monte Cristo, Greece, and Constantinople.

Plot Stage 2

Conflict, Rising Action: The Conflict is introduced: Will Dantès get revenge on his enemies? In the Rising Action, Dantès is consumed by the desire for revenge. Over the next 2 years Faria educates him in mathematics. philosophy, history, and several languages. They make an escape plan but Faria becomes ill before they can carry it out. He reveals the location of a hidden treasure. Faria dies and Dantès escapes to find the treasure, then heads to Marseilles to find Caderousse, who reveals the details of the betrayal. After rescuing his former employer Mr. Morrell from bankruptcy, Dantès disappears for 10 years, then reappears in Rome as the fabulously wealthy Count of Monte Cristo. Methodically, he sets about an elaborate scheme to exact revenge against the men responsible for his imprisonment.

Exposition: Edmond Dantès, of Marseilles, seems to have the perfect life. He is about to become the captain of a ship, he is engaged to a beautiful and kind young woman, Mercédès, and he is well liked by almost everyone who knows him. This perfect life, however, stirs up dangerous jealousy among some of Dantès's so-called friends, Danglars, Mondego, and Caderousse, who accuse him of treason. Villeforte fears that Dantès will reveal that his father is involved in a plot with Napoleon so he sentences him to prison on Château d'If, With no recourse to justice, after 6 years he despairs. Ready to commit suicide, he unexpectedly meets Abbé Faria, a priest who tunnels into Dantès's cell while trying to escape. Faria befriends him and learns his story, discerning that Dantès has been framed by his enemies.

Plot Stage 3

Climax: One by one, Dantès entraps each of his persecutors, using their crimes and weaknesses against them. He draws out each act of revenge to the point of suspense.

Plot Stage 4

Denouement: Caderousse dies after being stabbed by Villeforte's illegitimate and violent son; Mondego's reputation and relationship with his family is ruined and he kills himself; Villefort goes insane; and Danglars is left penniless.

THEMES

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Human Revenge vs. Divine Retribution Peace Alienation vs. Love

CONFLICT

Man vs. Society, Man vs. Himself Will Dantès be able to punish his enemies so that he can finally be at peace?

CHARACTERS:

Protagonist: Edmond Dantès

19 y.o. seaman, about to become a captain, engaged to Mercedes.

Antagonist: Danglars, Mondego, Caderousse: all are iealous of Dantes for various reasons. Villeforte fears that Dantes will reveal his father is involved in a plot with Napoleon.

Others: Mercedes: Dante's fiancé

Abbé Faria: Priest that Dante meets in prison. He rescues Dante from despair and leaves him his hidden treasure when he dies.

Monsieur Morrel: Ship owner, Dante's boss

Haydée: a beautiful and mysterious Greek woman who accompanies the Count of Monte

And a huge cast of characters, too many to mention!

Plot Stage 5

Conclusion: Dantès rejects Mercedes, who he still feels was untrue to him when she married Mondego out of despair. He finds true love with Haydée, who had been also been injured in Mondego's crimes. He finally recognizes that he cannot act in the place of God, but can only wait and hope for God to punish evil and reward good.
